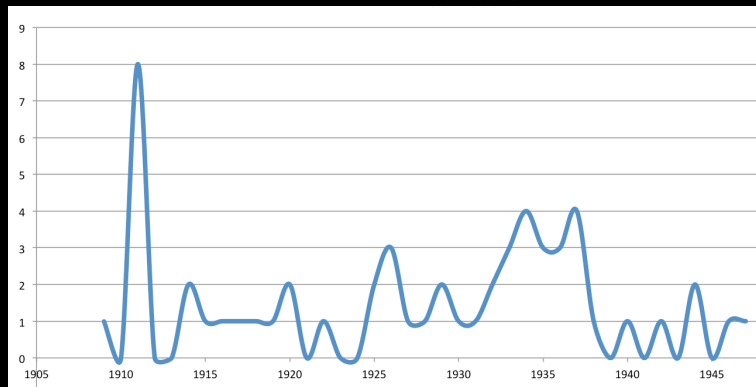

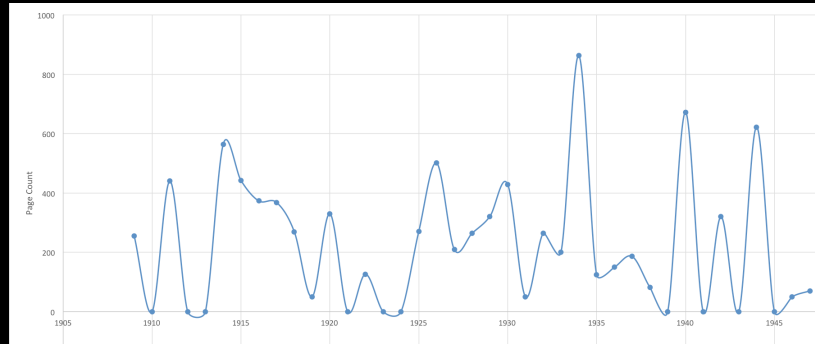


Books Published Annually, 1909–1947

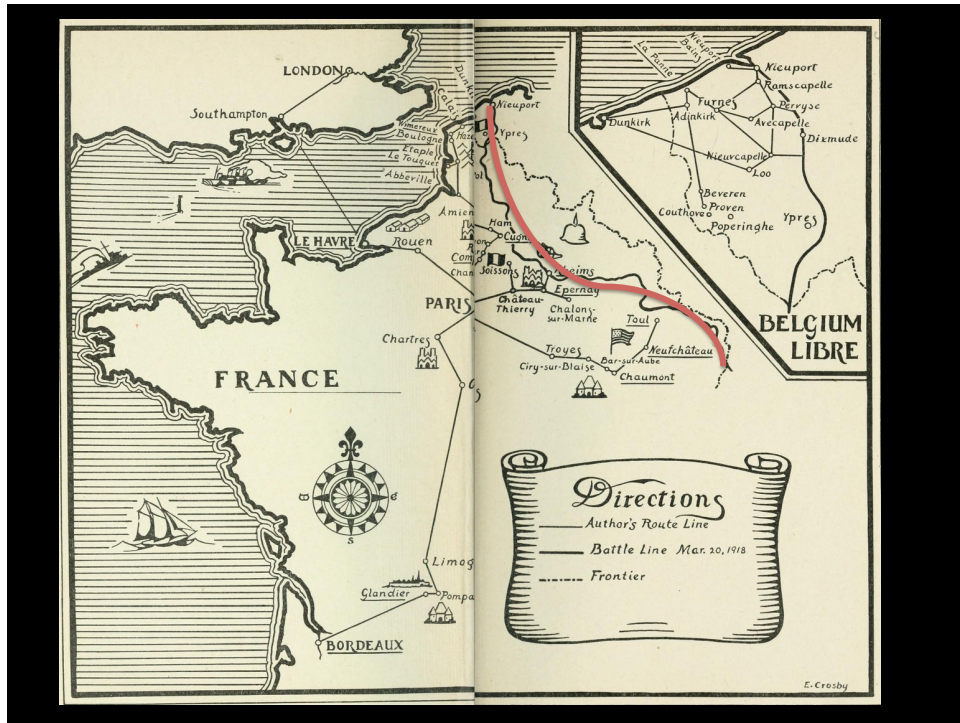
